Connections From the Airports

From Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport
Taoyuan Airport MRT: Both Express and Commuter train stop at Terminal 1 (A12) and Terminal 2 (A13), with trains arriving about every 7.5 minutes, alternating between the two lines. The Express train takes about 35-40 minutes to Taipei, Taoyuan Airport to Taipei Main Station. The Commuter train takes about 60 minutes.

Taiwan High Speed Rail: MRT trains to Taoyuan HSR Station are available at both Terminals 1 and 2.

Passenger Bus: Tourists can travel directly to Taipei, Taichung, Xinyi, Taoyuan, Zhongli, Taichung and Hsinchu by passenger buses, which are available at both Terminals 1 and 2.

Terminal 2 bus stop: Airport bus stop on the first floor.

*Please inquire bus fares and ticket purchases at the Passenger Bus Ticket Counter. Taxi 24-hour taxi services are available at both Terminals 1 and 2. Service is provided at all areas of Taiwan. Reasonable standard fares apply depending on destination.

From Taipei Songshan Airport
This airport is situated in the Taipei urban area, providing convenient transportation. A Taipei Metro station and city buses are located near the departure hall. Taxi charge standard fares according to taxi meters.

From Taichung Ching Chuan Kang Airport
Tourists can take the city bus to Taichung Railway Station and Taichung High Speed Rail Station to connect to other metropolitan areas. Fares vary depending on distances. For more information about round trips to Sun Moon Lake and High Speed Rail stations, please visit TaiwanTrip.com.tw

From Kaohsiung International Airport
In the airport terminal, tourists can take the Red Line Kaohsiung Mass Rapid Transit to Kaohsiung Railway Station (Main Station) or to the High Speed Rail Zhongyuan Station and travel to other cities. Bus and taxi rental services are available; please visit the official website for more information.

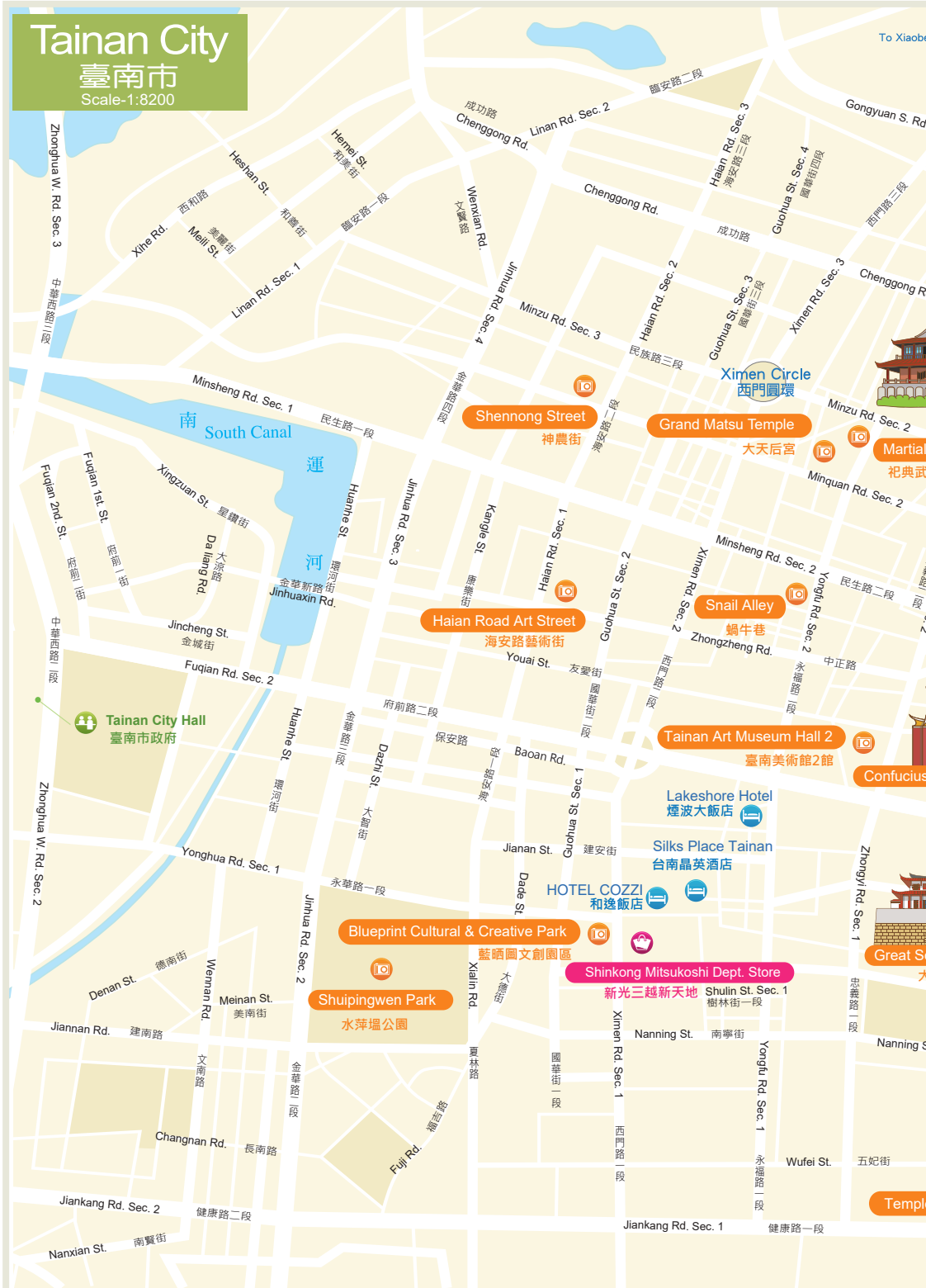
Other Information

Traveler's Cheques and Credit Cards
Please exchange your traveler's cheque for cash in advance. Traveler's cheques are not accepted in most shops in Taiwan, whereas credit cards are popular. Visa, MasterCard, American Express, JCB, China UnionPay, Diners Clubs International are well-accepted. If you travel to the Taiwan countryside, make sure you prepare enough cash in case credit card service is not available.

Voltage and Power Sockets
Taiwan uses 110V or 220V electric current, and the frequency is 60Hz. Please note your electronic appliance specifications if brought from abroad. With purchases totaling NT\$2,000 or more in one store on a given day, you can receive tax refunds at airports or customs stations within 30 days of making the purchase or before you go through customs in the airport's departure hall.

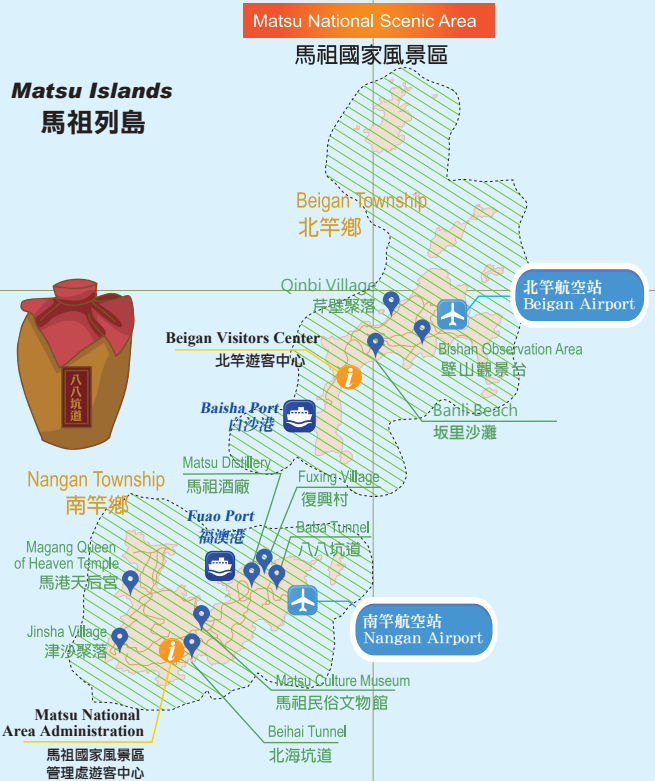
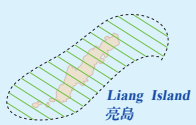
Service Charges

臺灣旅遊地圖

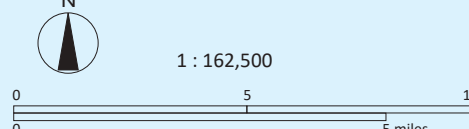
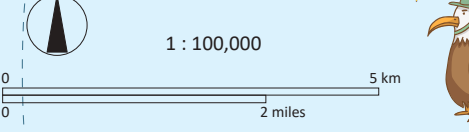
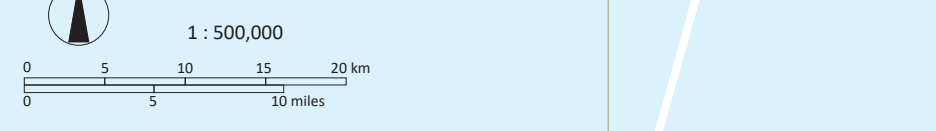
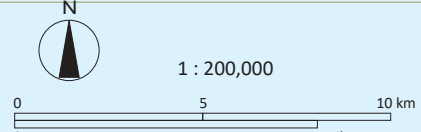
